Appalachia Service Project 2017 registration kicked off Sunday, February 19 at 8:00 a.m. in the church office for the 38 spots on our team.** ASP works to rebuild substandard housing for low-income families with the goal of making homes warmer, safer, and drier. This year we'll be heading to Tennessee the week of June 25 – July 1, and we invite you to come along! We register by "category" (male/female youth, young adult, and adult) on a "first-come-first-served" basis and will start waiting lists as each category fills. The cost is \$225 paid at time of registration and scholarships are available, if needed. - Lily Pads for the Pediatric Oncology Unit at WakeMed, Saturday March 25, 10:00 a.m.** Nick Konkler was a high school aged cancer patient, who had battled cancer since age 4. He noticed children having a difficult time with IV poles and had a lightbulb moment. Nick's idea was to build in his shop class IV pole "lily pads" (skateboard-like devices that allow patients to get around the hospital easier). However, he never got the chance. In February 2015, Nick died at just 17 after a long battle with leukemia and a childhood brain tumor. His high school gathered to honor their classmate and finish his project. Now churches, classrooms and others around the country continue to honor Nick by constructing and donating Lily Pads to local hospitals. - **Walking the Labyrinth:** “Walking the Labyrinth,” a daytime Lenten study tracing the path toward Jerusalem with the Gospel of Mark’s twists and turns of Jesus’ life, will be led by Medora Hix. The study will be offered on Wednesdays at 11:30 a.m. in Room 102, March 8 through the rest of Lent. One session will include the use of our own labyrinth.

The Season of Lent is upon us.

We keep track of time and seasons of the year by using calendars that provide us opportunities to observe, commemorate, and celebrate certain events or occasions. The changing seasons of the year also provide us with recurring opportunities to celebrate the Christian Faith in worship. The Christian church, following earlier Jewish tradition, has long used the seasons of the year as an opportunity for festivals and holidays, sacred time set aside to worship God as the Lord of life.

Lent is marked by a time of prayer and preparation to celebrate Easter. Since Sundays celebrate the resurrection of Jesus, the six Sundays that occur during Lent are not counted as part of the 40 days of Lent, and are referred to as the Sundays **in** Lent. The number 40 is connected with many biblical events, but especially with the forty days Jesus spent in the wilderness preparing for His ministry by facing the temptations that could lead him to abandon his mission and calling. Christians today use this period of time for introspection, self-examination, and repentance. This season of the year is equal only to the Season of Advent in importance in the Christian year, and is part of the second major grouping of Christian festivals and sacred time that includes Holy Week, Easter, and Pentecost.
