#### Adult Education Sunday School Classes

Faith TODAY adult class this week is "More Than Enough," more on the importance and advantages of living the Christian life without excess. The class will be led by Sheri Mitten in Rm. 102.

**Bible and Beyond** will conclude its study of *Wisdom Literature and the Prophets* from the Efrid Bible Study video series. Next week, April 15, is a new Efrid study: Paul's letter to the Galatians. Efrid studies are dynamic and informative. Join in with Lisa and Alan Ward, leaders, in the library.

Faith and Family is currently looking at the book 100 Things Every Child Should Know Before Confirmation: A Guide for Parents and Youth Leaders. This resource offers an overview of one hundred essential topics that all children growing up in the church should learn about. It includes key Bible stories, church history, the sacraments and creeds, world religions, and more. Each entry includes a brief summary, a suggestion for how parents can explore this item with their children, and ideas for integrating the topic into the child's overall Christian education. #### Looking ahead:

- April 15 is this year's Guatemala mission fundraiser: the Wall 'O Mission! Our ministry in Nimasac, Guatemala is flourishing. The scholarship program is supporting 18 young people, Stage 1 of Phase 2 of the building project is getting ready to begin, and we've been in conversation with Agua Viva International about the possibility of getting clean water in Nimasac underway. Please be generous.
- Food, Friends, and Fun (we're thinking of renaming it F3) returns to CPC on Wednesdays this summer. Sign-ups for volunteer positions will begin April 22, but please schedule available days on your calendars now.

Mission in the Community and Beyond-Spanish Classes offered at CPC:

Beginning April 11, Cary Presbyterian will host three different levels of Spanish classes for members and associates in support of volunteer service in faith community outreach programs offered to Latino neighbors, and our Guatemalan mission. Classes will be on Wednesdays during the daytime (hours shown below), starting on April 11 and concluding June 13 (10 weeks). The teacher is Paulina Rodriguez-Ortega, originally from Colombia and now a US citizen, who has taught Spanish for many years.


There will be time following the presentation for a question and answer session. Duration is approximately one hour plus time for Q&A. Childcare will be provided for this program.

Mark your calendars: we hope to see you there!






Town Hall Meeting Follow-up
