

# 1st Sunday in Lent



will invite each other to reflect and listen with one another for the purpose of building up life together at CPC.


Rooted in respect and confidentiality, a process of **mutual invitation** shapes the dialogue so each person has the chance to be heard with all group members listening.


Know Chocolate for Lent begins this Sunday, Feb. 18



## Triple F Group Meeting, Feb. 19



# Read and Feed Diversify Our Books Campaign Special Event, February 25





(Bring a friend!) These programs promise to be informative and thought-provoking. There will be time following each presentation for a O & A session


# Clarence Darrow: A One Man Play March 15, 7:00 p.m.


On March 15 at 7:00 p.m. John Robinson, a retired teacher in Winston-Salem, will perform Clarence Darrow: A One Man Play by David Rintels. The two-act play features the life of Darrow, a determined and hardworking lawyer who fought for basic human rights. Robinson chronicles Darrow's achievements and failures in the form of monologues. In the first act, he begins with a discussion on capital punishment before transitioning into how he became a lawyer. The

second act involves instances where Darrow had to defend himself. The performance highlights his journey to and through the legal profession, various trials he worked on, and the issues that were important to him, such as equal rights, the economy, and the death penalty.

April 29 at 7:00 p.m. a program called Be SMART will be presented by speakers from Moms Demand Action. This group supports the 2nd Amendment, but believes that common-sense solutions can help decrease the escalating epidemic of gun violence that kills too many of our loved ones every day. 


## Next CPC Blood Drive, Wednesday, May 2




OR sign up for a name tag at the table by the TV in the Narthex.
